Wood sage (*Salvia x sylvestris*), like clary sage and common sage, is a member of the Lamiaceae family. It is also known as lavender-leaf sage and Spanish sage. Wood sage greatly resembles common sage. Its evergreen foliage is dense and green-gray in color. When the plant blooms in June and July, the stems are covered with a multitude of lavender-blue flowers.

The plant is native to Spain and southern France, and our production is a combination of wild harvest and conventional cultivation. We harvest the aerial parts of the plant, leaves, and stems, then steam-distill them to obtain the essential oil. This oil is clear to pale yellow, with subtle green, fresh, aromatic, and resinous notes. It is rich in cineole 1-8 and camphor, giving it antiseptic, anti-infectious, and expectorant properties.
