
Social responsibility at Albert Vieille

Product profil: olibanum













Harvest calendar



The olibanum trees (Boswellia carterii Birdw.) of Somaliland, a self-proclaimed, self-governing republic in northwestern Somalia, grow wild in the region's craggy mountains. The plant is endemic to this land and is not found anywhere else in the world. Cultivation of olibanum trees holds great importance for the local population, as the activity is one of the main sources of income.

In this part of Africa, where the local people are hit hard by drought and the poverty rate is one of the highest known, olibanum cultivation is one of the few ways to earn a livelihood. The men are willing to risk their lives to harvest the olibanum, which often grows on steep cliffs.

Olibanum trees are harvested once a year in summer, from June to August. To extract the resins, incisions are made in the trees using metal hand tools. The sap is a viscous, milky-white liquid that oozes from these cuts in the tree. This precious substance is then collected, dried, sorted by quality, and distilled, to then be applied in many ways to enhance health and wellbeing.

Today, special attention must be accorded the olibanum tree, as this resource is struggling to regenerate on its own. With rising global demand, it is common to see the tree being harvested several times a year. The greater the size or number of incisions, the weaker the tree becomes, and the greater the risk that this natural resource will vanish entirely. This makes the sustainable harvest of Somaliland olibanum all the more critical.

Protecting the olibanum tree starts with educating and raising awareness within local communities about the tree's preservation. Our support of such efforts is done through our supply partner for olibanum gum: This enterprise makes sure its collectors are properly trained, provides medical care, and ensures families are supplied with basic necessities.

Our market position: we process the olibanum gum at our production center in Spain to create two extracts: essential oil and resinoid.

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Blackcurrant buds France

Absolute





The weather in 2018 was relatively dry for these shrubs. Despite a rainy spring, growers had to occasionally irrigate to compensate for this lack of water, ensuring the blackcurrant bushes could develop properly. The advantage of this dry climate was that the plants were rarely unwell and were able to resist insect attacks. The cold weather, which came early this winter, also favored the development of blackcurrant buds. The harvest therefore began in late 2018. New plots of land were also planted over the course of the year, so as to cope with any potential short-term scarcity. Prices should remain unchanged over last year.

Our market position: our blackcurrant bud absolute is produced at our production plant in Seville. Its main constituents are delta-3-carene, terpinolene, and beta-caryophyllene.



Osmanthus China

Absolute








The 2018 weather conditions were the same as those of the two preceding years. Dry weather affected the growth and bloom of osmanthus flowers. The high temperatures rendered picking more difficult and led to a rise in labor costs to offset the hardship of this work. Production remained steady at last year's level, but demand has increased. This raw material, particularly popular on the perfume and food markets, has seen a drop in stock. Taken together, these various factors have impacted the raw material's purchase price, leading to an increase.

Our market position: the production of osmanthus absolute has been finalized in our production center in Spain.




Patchouli heart Indonesia

Essential oil



Overall patchouli production decreased in 2018 on the islands of Sulawesi and Sumatra due to natural disasters, a dry season, and crop conversion. The principal difficulty lies more in the realm of supply than production: Freight transport has been impacted by the cumulative effects of natural disasters, causing market tensions. Production remains uncertain for the next two to three months and a price increase is very likely.

Our market position: At our production center in Spain, we produce a patchouli heart essential oil through rectification of patchouli essential oil, a process that lets us enrich the extract's patchoulol content, the molecule responsible for patchouli's characteristic odor.




Sandalwood New Essential oil Caledonia



In New Caledonia, the government has taken drastic measures to protect sandalwood from pillaging. It has ratified a complete ban on the export of unprocessed sandalwood, living or dead. In the provinces, governmental orders have established cutting quotas and reforestation norms to control the exploitation of sandalwood and ensure resource regeneration. Legislation also requires that the raw material be distilled on site to sustain the economic health of the supply chain. The distilleries that we work with are very concerned about the many dimensions of sustainability in cultivating this resource, with standards that sometimes even surpass the criteria imposed by the legislation.

Our market position: Sandalwood is distilled year round. We have quantities of this product available.



Tonka bean Brazil

Absolute







Despite an unstable climate vacillating between rain and sun, the 2018 tonka bean harvest reached a total of 80 tons for all of Brazil. Production is fairly high and prices have dropped.

Our market position: we have tonka bean absolute made from the concrete processed in our production center. It is produced through solvent extraction of the beans, which are then washed with the alcohol of the concrete. It has a maximum coumarin level of 80%.



Vetiver Haiti

Essential oil







The production of vetiver essential oil is slowly resuming after having stopped for the year-end rainy season. Farmers are increasingly reluctant to work with this raw material because of a low return on investment. Production costs are still high due to the price of a barrel of oil. To reduce their production costs, some farmers are distilling for shorter periods of time, and this has affected the quality of some vetiver essential oils. Furthermore, civil unrest has caused disruption in certain areas of Haiti, interfering with the supply of fuel, equipment, and transportation as a whole. Today, stocks are limited, but demand has slowed.
